News from the Parish Council

Following on from the B&NES Highways visit over the summer it was agreed at the next parish council meeting to install further 20mph roundels in between Haynes and the Spar. We are also looking at updating the flashing speed sign coming into the village from Farmborough and near the Station Inn, Hallatrow. The data collected from the new sign on the Paulton Road has shown a reduction of speed at this entry point over a 6-month period. Due to speeding within the village being regularly highlighted as an issue it would be useful to have this equipment at all our VAS signs.

Thanks to the funds allocated from the Ward Empowerment Fund we were able to purchase an additional 2 planters located outside of the primary school.

In September an outline planning application was submitted for 130 homes on fields in between Paulton and Hallatrow. In relation to our new Neighbourhood Plan the parish council voted to object based on the following: the application makes no reference to the policies in the plan. Any future application should provide a full and evidence-based response to the Neighbourhood Plan. There will be direct and indirect impacts from this proposed development on services and infrastructure within the parish of High Littleton which have not been addressed in the proposal. In particular traffic congestion and pedestrian safety issues, which we already have especially near Hallatrow bridge. An application of this size must address these issues, etc. As a parish council it is really positive to see the plan being able to be used in practice.

The village Christmas trees will be put up in High Littleton and Hallatrow near the end of November, please feel free to add a touch of Christmas sparkle if you wish.

1. The site sits predominantly within the parish of High Littleton where a Neighbourhood Plan was made in June this year. The applicant makes no reference to the policies of the plan. Any future application should provide a full and evidenced based response to the High Littleton and Hallatrow Neighbourhood Plan.

2. There will be direct and indirect impacts from this proposed development on services and infrastructure within the parish of High Littleton that are not addressed in the proposal. In particular, traffic congestion and pedestrian safety are significant issues for High Littleton / Hallatrow. A development of this size must address these concerns, including a full response to policies PD2b and PD5 of the High Littleton & Hallatrow Neighbourhood Plan (repeated below for completeness).

PD2b: Any new small-scale development must demonstrate consideration for highway and pedestrian safety and support easement of traffic congestion throughout the Parish, for example, by providing necessary parking.

Any new small-scale development must consider the need to support a sustainable and safe commuter corridor that protects the parish residents and also supports commuters utilising this route.

PD5: Where appropriate, new small scale developments must demonstrate support for safe walking routes throughout the parish and, in particular, routes to key parish assets (including the school and recreation ground). Where any significant enhancements are proposed, a consultation with residents is encouraged.

Greyfield Wood - temporarily closing

The Woodland Trust is having to make the difficult decision to close Greyfield Wood in November for approximately 2 months. Phytophthora ramorum, a fungal-like organism, is infecting the larch here. We have been issued with a plant health notice which gives us a legal obligation to remove all the larch. It can spread rapidly by spores and blocks the trees' water transport system leading to dieback and eventual death. This can happen over a very short period, so we are required to complete this work quickly.

At the same time, we are bringing forward other work that we had planned to do early next year:

Continue the gradual removal of Norway spruce and Douglas fir. By gradually removing (thinning) these trees we increase the light that reaches the woodland floor which enables other species of trees and plants to grow. The aim is to encourage the growth of native broadleaf trees and shrubs which will support a wider range of wildlife.

Remove path side diseased ash and sweet chestnut which are dying and becoming unsafe. But we don't want to remove all these as standing dead wood is an important home for wildlife and should be present in our woods. To avoid having to remove all of these we will reconfigure some of the path network (permanently closing some of the unofficial paths).

We are also exploring an opportunity to 'slow the flow' of water within the woods. Many of our woods have had drainage works done historically. By reversing this management and retaining some of the water within the wood we will make it more resilient to climate change (hotter and drier summers) and improve the condition of the wood for wildlife. We will be using timber from this woodland to create the woody dams that will be put in the watercourse.

The extent of this work means that we need to close this wood for the safety of the visitors and the contractors who are working here. Tree felling with the required machinery is a dangerous activity. We also need to extract the wood via the car park. We will be selling the timber to a licensed timber merchant so we can recoup some of the costs and maintain the woodland in the future for the benefit of the people and nature.

We understand that this is disappointing for all those who like to walk here or undertake activities here. We will aim to keep the closure as short as possible.

It's a great way to meet people, support the community and help the environment.



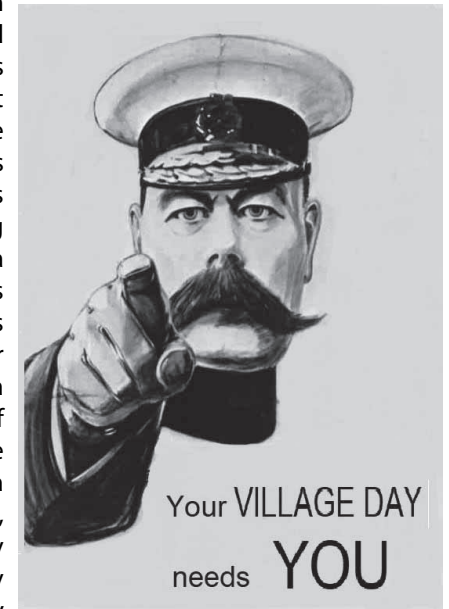

Every Thursday there is a service of Morning Prayer from 9.45am preceded by 15 minutes private prayer time but not during school holidays.

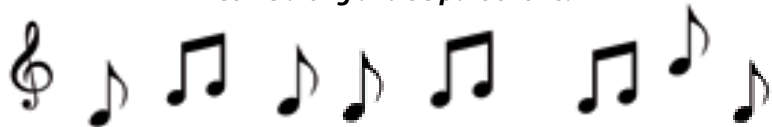

Holy Trinity Church Incarnation in creation

I want you to reflect for a moment on what it is to be incarnated, to be made of flesh and blood in a physical world. There is a vitality to the way we are connected to the world that it can be easy to lose sight of when we are consumed by business and by distractions. If you can, take a moment outside of these pressures to reflect and be thankful, just knowing the joy of incarnation by simply feeling yourself exist in a place. But I think that there is more to be experienced if you look at this as an actual relationship and you introduce the idea of a personal God. You can have a relationship with the world in the abstract, but the Christian faith is about both you and God being part of creation, and having a personal living relationship. This relationship is not one of work or exchange, where you need to earn God's favour or justify your place in the world. All God wants from you is to trust that He loves you, to trust the promise that this relationship is real. Once you see life through this lens then all your lived experience becomes part of this relationship, that all of life is about knowing and growing this connection with God, through your connection with the world, and your connection with the world through your relationship with God.
