News from the Parish Council

High Littleton Parish Council has installed an additional defibrillator at the north end of the village to improve coverage for that area. Michelle Appleyard kindly allowed the defibrillator to be fitted in a prominent position at the front of the SPAR shop, and her electrical contractor, Alton Electrical Services have fitted it for us free of charge. Thankyou! The defibrillator and storage box was predominantly funded by our District Councillor Ann Morgan from her annual Empowerment Grant provided to her by BANES. The balance of the funding was provided by the parish council. Parishioners are encouraged to undertake the free CPR/Defibrillator familiarity training which is on offer locally from time to time. All the parish council installed defibrillators in High Littleton and Hallatrow are regularly inspected to ensure they are ready to use.

Various streetlights in the village which are the responsible of the parish council have been repaired, with further works planned on lights at the bottom of Rotcombe lane.

Hopefully by the time this article is published Greyfield Wood will be open; we would like to thank residents for being patient while this work has been carried out by the Woodland Trust. Unfortunately we have noticed an increase in dog mess on the Clutton track towards the fields whilst the woods were closed. Please can we remind people to pick up after their dogs.

Planning Applications and Council's Comment

225/04448/PACOU Poultry Houses, Langfords Lane, High Littleton.

Prior approval request for the change of use from an agricultural building to an Apart Hotel comprising 3no. 1 bed flats, communal area and internal car parking for 4no. cars. High Littleton Parish Council's comment - A previous planning application for this site (24/03036/PACOU) was refused and a subsequent appeal was dismissed. In dismissing the appeal, the Planning Inspectorate's report made clear the highway safety issues associated with the application. These issues have not been addressed in the latest application. Further, since the previous application was dismissed, the High Littleton and Hallatrow Neighbourhood Plan has been made, which strengthens the need for planning applications to address safe walking routes (Policy PD5 refers). High Littleton Parish Council OBJECT to this application.

25/04445/ADCOU Poultry Houses, Langfords Lane, High Littleton.

Prior approval request for the conversion and change of use of 1 No. existing barn to 7 No. dwellings with associated operational development necessary to enable the conversion. High Littleton Parish Council's comment - Approval for 10 no. dwellings was previously approved on this site through application 24/03125/ADCOU. Since that application was approved and this new application for 7 no. dwellings (25/04445/ADCOU) was submitted, the High Littleton and Hallatrow Neighbourhood Plan has been made. High Littleton Parish Council OBJECT to this application as it does not address the policies in the plan, particularly Policy PD5: Safe Walking Routes.

25/04518/TPO Silver Birches Greyfield Road High Littleton BS39 6YF

T1 Oak - 6 metre radial reduction to reduce end weights and wind load, remove 2 x limbs and end weight reduction on 2 others, due to decay in the scaffold branches, and recent shedding of large limb.

High Littleton Parish Council's comment - support.

25/04658/FUL Gays Hill Bungalow, Bungays Hill, High Littleton, BS39 6JS.

Erection of a single storey front extensions to square off footprint. First floor extension to create two storey dwelling.

High Littleton Parish Council's comment - support provided the applicant demonstrates that appropriate visibility can be achieved for the new access as per the Highways response.

25/04835/FUL 11 Rotcombe Vale, High Littleton, BS39 6JZ.

Addition of insulation and new cedar cladding to replace existing tiles to the front elevation of the house.

High Littleton Parish Council's comment - support.

25/04742/PIP Poultry Houses, Langfords Lane, High Littleton.

Permission in Principle for the erection of 3no dwellings to replace an existing agricultural

building.

High Littleton Parish Council object to this application and support the concerns of residents and B&NES Highways. The site has a relevant planning history, and the recent decision relating to application 24/04751/PACOU and appeal APP/F0114/W/25/3364653 have been reviewed as part of this assessment. The highway authority concerns were described in some detail in response to that earlier application and also previous schemes that were submitted for the wider site. The local highway conditions have not changed since that time, and the general safety concerns that were raised remain the same.

News from the Rec Trust

The January AGM was an opportunity to look back on what had been achieved last year, the issues in maintaining the Rec and also discussing how we could enhance what is already there. First and foremost it was great to see so many people continuing to use the Rec throughout the year. Everyone from the Village Day, the Scouts, to regular school P.E. and events like Sports Day and Colour Run, football matches for young and the not so young, a host of walkers, kids & families playing and teenagers congregating. All that adds up to 2 acres worth of an incredibly important resource for the village.

The Chairman's report reflected on the fact that many users of the Rec probably don't know quite how much work goes into just maintaining and updating the ground and how difficult it can be to get extra help when needed. He acknowledged and thanked those that do help, from the Trustees who coordinate the activities, the Dog Owners Group out in all weathers and the local youngsters who join in for their Duke of Edinburgh award. Next the parish council who continued their backing financially which is so vital to keep us able to offer the facilities to the village. Thanks were also given to Ainley & Norah Fricker and the Rec Club Committee for letting us use the club for our meetings and also their support throughout the year. Everyone that helps is safeguarding it for all of us. Beyond regular maintenance and of course the popular flower and veg showings, the new gym equipment was a welcome addition in 2025 as was the centenary bench. Additionally, Paul Hooke started a project to increase planting and diversity on the wildlife bank and that can continue into future years. Funding is obviously vital to all of the above and the AGM reported a surplus of £1201 and healthy reserves of £8500 – enough for a year's running costs and repairs!

Other items discussed were the future of the Dog Owners Group which urgently needs more volunteers to continue the service they provide by clearing the field of dog mess and litter. Please contact us if you can help. On a more positive note, it was agreed to proceed with the proposal to renovate & refurbish the old "Pigeon" room/Ref's room, including creating a space to serve refreshments for any community groups or sports teams using the Rec. The next stage will be to get more quotes, work out a funding strategy and look at the practicalities of how it would operate.

We also held a short EGM to adopt amendments to our governing document to make it less restrictive when recruiting new Trustees. These changes were approved by the Charity Commission and were adopted at the meeting.

In the Christian story of creation, God makes all things and says they are good, with humans places intended to be ambassadors of God's love in the world (this is what it is to be 'in the image of God'). As with everything in the Bible, as well as telling a historical story, it also describes the repeating patterns of our lives. We are told that that the strain of holding all these judgments and divisions weighs us down and makes our hearts heavy. When you realise that judging other people is not our job, you can put down this heavy burden and pick up the task of loving. When we do this, you get the feeling of what it is to be really human and really alive. So relax, put down your baggage, and in each situation you find yourself, just think 'how can I love this person?'. Carers' Centre Secures Funding

The Carers' Centre for Bath and North East Somerset has secured a seven-year contract to continue its work to support thousands of adult and young carers. This means security for the ongoing provision of vitally-important services and support for unpaid adult carers in the region.

The Carers' Centre was established as a charity for unpaid carers, anyone looking after a loved one who relies on this support, in 1996. In the thirty years that have followed, the centre has strengthened and grown its offer, now providing a support line and wellbeing services for over 6,200 adult carers and 1,000 young carers. It has won the nationally accredited 'Excellence for Carers' Award and attracted funding from a wide range of sources, Henry Smith and Children in Need.

The contract with Bath & North East Somerset Council means that hundreds more carers will be able to access these services, including via an upcoming new AI tool on the Carers' Centre website that will signpost users to relevant advice and guidance, alongside the support line. Each and every one of us is likely to care, or be cared for, at some point in our lives, and the support carers provide saves the taxpayer a huge amount of money. Providing carers with the support they need, in turn, is essential.

Additional funding is required to fund added-value wellbeing activities, so the centre is continuing to fund-raise and will be entering a team in the Bath Half in 2026. The centre also has a range of volunteering and some trustee openings available. 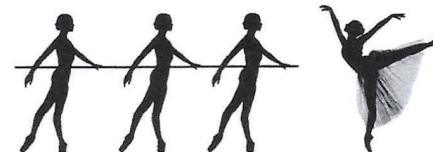
